New York's Village Halloween Parade – Chief Puppet Designer for nation's largest night parade. As co-director of the artist ensemble Superior Concept Monsters, designed annual performance works to lead event, each involving hundreds of volunteers and an audience of nearly 2 million spectators. •New Orleans Reborn (2005) - The phoenix rises above a jazz funeral marked by four giant lanterns of New Orleans buildings.

•Cakewalk (2004) – 25 giant cake-hats evoke the African-American legacy of the jazz burlesque.

• Trickster (2003) - Giant puppets conjure the trickster archetype from six different ethnic traditions.

•Play (2002) – A living chess board explores the idea of Homo Ludens, or how gaming defines culture.

• Phoenix (2001) – A newly arisen firebird carries the spirit of New York aloft, six weeks after 9/11

•Baba Yaga (2001) - The Russian witch, accompanied by her chicken-legged hut and enchanted trees, examines the crone.

• Evolution (2000) - In tribute to 2001: A Space Odyssey, a pageant of Apemen and Starmen track human evolution.

•Metamorphosis (1999) – 20'-tall caterpillars become luna moths, unfolding their wings as they parade forward.

*Morinesio's Midsummer Pageant* – Developed and designed an annual community procession for a small village in the Piedmont region of Italy, bringing together international artists and students with local residents. The project used local oral histories and Occitan ethnic folk traditions as the basis for the construction of large-scale puppets, masks, and other visual elements. 2001 – present.
